






Memorial Day Celebration

The National D-Day Memorial located in Bedford Virginia, held a Memorial Day celebration to honor those military members that died in service to our country. Skyhawk member and former POW Dave Carey was the keynote speaker for the event. Dave was shot down on August 31, 1967, and spent five and a half years in the infamous "Hanoi Hilton." At the time of his shootdown he was flying an A-4E in VA-163 from the USS Oriskany (CVA-34). After release Dave continued his Navy career retiring from active service in 1986. He then pursued a career as a motivational speaker.

OUR LIVES ON THE LINE The Air War Over North Viet Nam For A Navy Pilot And His Air Wing A Memoir


There have been many worthy books about the USS Oriskany, CVA-34, and her Air Wing, CAG-19, during the conflict in Southeast Asia. From the beginning Tonkin Gulf incident, the awful October 1966 fire aboard Oriskany that killed forty-four pilots, numerous seamen, and wounded one hundred fifty-six others; and the 1967 time period where CAG-19 became known as "Bloody 19."

Kenneth Adams' account covers his voyage thru Naval Aviation beginnings and two combat cruises as pilot with Anack Squadron 163, the "Saints," on the Oriskany and a third Combat cruise with the same squadron on USS Hancock, CVA-19, in 1968.

What makes "Mule's" book exceptional is that it is recreated from a faithful journal he kept, and it is illustrated by his own extraordinary combat photography and record of squadron people. In July 1967, CAG-19 started flying three major strikes a day against highly defended "ALPHA" targets, with most pilots flying two of those strikes. The losses were extremely high. At one point, the Saints had six operational aircraft out of fourteen at the onset of the tour. The CAG (Air Wing Commander), started calling the Saint's Skipper "A senior detachment officer" instead of a Squadron Commander! At one point, Adams had to fly an Alpha Strike in an airplane with NO Radio!

The Saint's original call sign given to Adams was "Animal." That often came out as "An..Dy..Mule" in combat. That changed after an Alpha Strike against Hanoi, when a Crusader pilot tried to warn Adams about a Surface to Air Missile (SAM) that was tracking him, and he couldn't get "An.. Dy..Mule" out fast enough. The missile explosion somehow wasn't fatal, but after the mission, Adams' call sign was changed to "Mule.

Air Wing Nineteen's losses are horrifying. Adams chronicles the number of hits on his own airplane, as well as losses of his friends and in other squadrons that he witnessed. At one



point, Adams states that "Being good wasn't enough. You also had to be lucky."

Adams is candid about coping with that kind of stress, both aboard ship and on liberty. Those of us that lived through treatment of combat veterans back in the United States by civilians will understand Mule's fistfights with them.

Kenneth Adams was good, and he was lucky. He survived and has self-published a worthy book. Highly Recommended!

A copy of the email I sent to my Children and oldest Grandson - ALL know who Ron Tardio was and that he saved my life!!


ALL - (7/25) would have been **Ron Tardio**'s 79th birthday - he died at age 23 in the ship fire on 26 Oct 1966.

Forever etched in my memory is Ron pulling the curtain of my bunk, shaking me, telling me - "Tony, it's really bad, you have to get up" - and before I could say a word to Ron, he unknowingly ran out of the bunk room aft towards the fire - died in the fire of smoke inhalation. The same would have happened to me IF not for . . a 'mid-watch' on the Bridge . . at the encouragement of CDR Juntilla, CIC Officer (he died in the fire) . . I wanted to transfer to CIC from COMM.

Had I not had that "mid-watch" of 4 hours on the Bridge (in addition to the 12 hours I'd already stood in Communications during the previous day 10/25) - getting to my bunk about 0430 hours 10/26 - was tired - did hear the alarm "fire, fire" - but turned over to go back to sleep - lots of "coincidences" - just wasn't my time "to buy the farm".

IF you Google Search - "Ron Tardio" - his picture shows up on 'The Virtual Wall.org'. I sure am very thankful for ALL seven of my Family . . thankful for Ron getting me to get up, **to save my life.**

ECM Countermeasures on the Saints A-4E: submitted by Ed Copher

On the A-4E with the ECM ALQ-100 black box in the Hell Hole, I had to remove the hell hole door to get access to the ECM black box. I used vise grip pliers to grip the hinge pin and then hammer the hinge pins out. With the door off just had enough room to get the 100 lb black box in & out. The aircraft gun's pressure bottles were mounted next to the box, and every time they shot the guns, the vibration from the guns broke the electronics in the ECM box. I was always encouraging the pilots to not use the guns. The hell hole door was not easy to put back on either....that's why they moved the ECM box to the top humpback on later model A-4's. The ECM black box was classified, so everytime we had the box out on the flightdeck, we covered it with an old raincoat. Also each time we went into port, we had to remove all the boxes and store them in a secure area. In 1968 on the Hancock, I was watching VA-155 with the new A-4F humpback, they were loading the ECM box for the first time up on the humpback, they had a special hoist to do the job of lifting the 100 lb box. Well, somehow they managed to drop the box from the top of the aircraft, onto the top of the aircraft wing...oops!


New Navy Enlistment Bonuses




